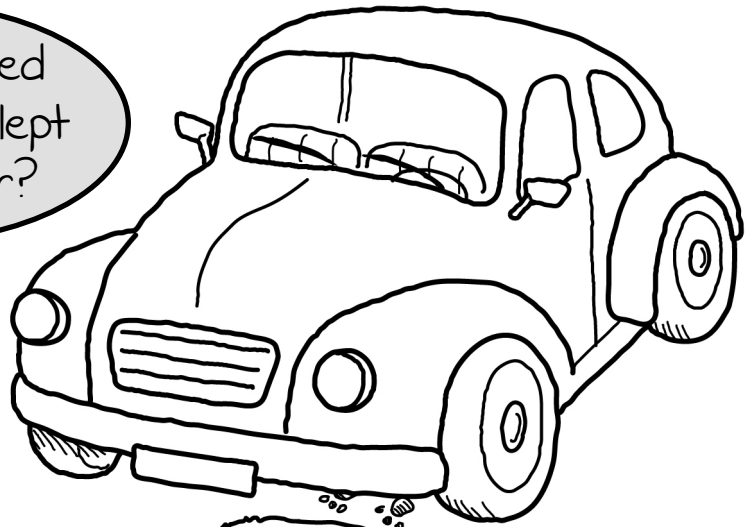


Preposition opposites

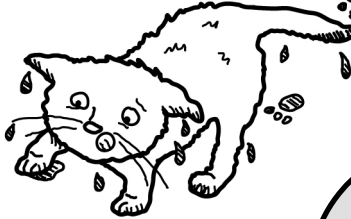


What happened when the cat slept under the car?

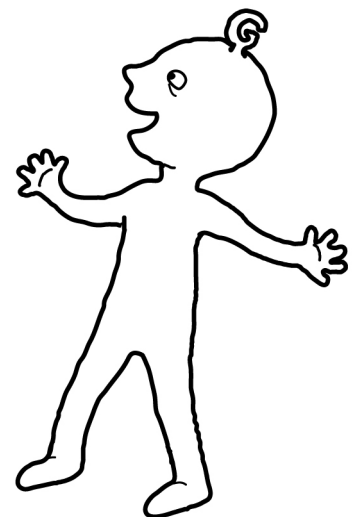
