Hyphens

Hyphens look exactly the same as a single dash, but they can join two words together, making compound words. They can make sense of phrases that might be ambiguous. Like these:


a man eating tiger would be a man eating a tiger.

a man-eating tiger would be a tiger eating a man.


a cat eating mouse would be a cat eating a mouse.

a cat-eating mouse would be a mouse eating a cat.

When you use a hyphen in this way, you make a **compound word**.
