## Sound bites

Words break into sound units, or beats, which are called 'syllables'. You need to sound words aloud to find out how many syllables they have. Remember you're to think about how they sound, not how they look.

Tip: Every syllable contains at least one vowel.

For example:
When nine thousand aliens landed in the school playground, our headteacher went wild.
